

Isaiah 21:11-17 + 24:13-15

Part of the "And It Came to Pass at Midnight" passage from the Passover Haggadah

Isaiah 21:11-12 - "The burden of Dumah. He calleth to me out of Seir, Watchman, what of the night? Watchman, what of the night? The watchman said, The morning cometh, and also the night: if ye will enquire, enquire ye: return, come."

Dumah is Edom

Rashi - "Morning has come": I have the ability to make the morning shine for you.
"and also night": is prepared for the wicked at the time of the end.

Another passage from "And It Came to Pass at Midnight" from the Passover Haggadah:

2 Kings 19:35 – 20:7

2 Kings 19:35 - "And it came to pass that night, that the angel of the LORD went out, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians an hundred fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses."

Isaiah 24:13-15 (NET) - "This is what will happen throughout the earth, among the nations. It will be like when they beat an olive tree, and just a few olives are left at the end of the harvest."

The destruction of Egypt by the plagues is compared to what God will do throughout the earth to Israel's enemies.

Therefore, the response of the faithful:

Isaiah 24:14-15 - "They lift their voices and shout joyfully; they praise the majesty of the LORD in the west. So in the east extol the LORD, along the seacoasts extol the fame of the LORD God of Israel."
